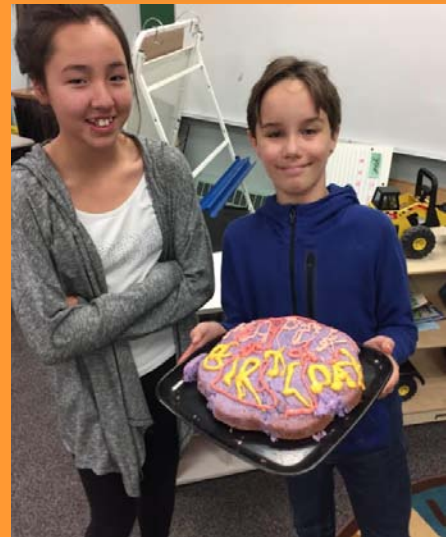
Recesses will be outside until the temperature, with wind chill, is -30°
